World War I

As an historian, I will be answering the key questions: Was World War 1 really the 'war to end all wars'?

and

What was life like for a child during World War 2? How do we know?

As a geographer, I am learning which countries were central powers, allied powers and neutral countries during WW1 and how Germany's territory changed before and after the war.

As a scientist I will learn:

- to recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines.
- to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye.
- to explain how the human eye sees objects.
- to explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.

In my Physical Education, I will be learning basketball and gymnastic skills.

As a musician, I will play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using my voice with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression

In Art I will be telling stories through drawings using different mediums.

At Farthinghoe we use **SCARF** (Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience, Friendship) as our programme of study for PHSE which aims to equip our pupils with the knowledge, understanding, skills and strategies required to become healthy, independent and responsible members of society. This is achieved through a 2 year programme of study across our mixed age classes. For further information of what your child is learning this term, please ask your child's class teacher.

In my study of French, I will be learning language connected to myself and my family.

In Computing, I will be learning to capture, edit and manipulate video.

In my study of English, my key text is Private Peaceful (Michael Morpurgo). I will also read other texts about WW1. As a writer, I will produce a poem, a letter and a recount description.

As a mathematician, I am learning about fractions, how to multiply 4 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers and to use long division. I am also learning to reason about numbers and explain my reasoning.
